- 1. **CALL TO ORDER** Meeting was called to order at 1:15 p.m.

4. **RECOGNITION OF PAST GBID TRUSTEES**

Introduction of Trustees and staff and recognition and appreciation of past Trustees took place.

5. TRUSTEE ELECTION – Returning Officer, Rob McWilliam

One Trustee term was up for re-election, Charles Childress stepped down and we had two candidates running for the position of Trustee: Daniel Zwiercan, and Lisa Alcos. Advertising for the AGM and Trustee vacancy was advertised in the April edition of the Express Lines, as well as posted online and on community notice boards. Nominations were accepted until April 18th. The election was by secret ballot. The successful candidate was Lisa Alcos.

6. AUDITED FINANCIAL REPORT – Dwayne Dunn; DMD Chartered Accounting Firm

Dwayne Dunn gave a verbal report of the financial position of GBID, and then took questions from the community members.

7. REPORT FROM THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES CHAIR – Chuck Childress

Chuck Childress presented a verbal report, outlining the GBID boundaries, and objects as per our Letters Patent. The possibility of expansion to Shelter Point Road, and the Seniors Housing Development were also mentioned. The new Capital Expenditure Charges Bylaw was explained, as well as the Capital Replacement Reserve fund. The GBID Sand Filtration Pilot Project was discussed and the possibility of either raising taxes or borrowing funds to pay for upgrades to treat the water.

8. TRUSTEE HONORARIUM – Corporate Officer

9. **REPORT FROM THE FIRE CHIEF**

Rob McWilliam presented his report. Total incidents were 59. 8 fires, 32 medical first responder calls, 8 duty officer calls, 1 motor vehicle accident, 2 downed power lines, 5 medical evacuations, 1 boil water advisory, 2equests to provide traffic control. Rob also outlined the training, community outreach, and wildfire hazard preparations.

10. Fire Chief's Honorarium

MOTION to keep the Fire Chief's Honorarium to \$6,000 annually. MOVED by David Beech, SECONDED by Jim Cairns

11. WATER OPERATOR REPORT

George Kapetanakis reported on the Water Works for the GBID. In 2024 the water works treated and delivered 94,000 cubic meters of water to 248 connections. George discussed some of the issues that the water system faced in 2023 as well as the upgrades and new service connections that were completed.

Motion to accept the Water Operator's Report, MOVED by Francis Franklin and SECONDED Dave Northrup CARRIED
