

GILLIES BAY IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT

WATER TOLLS AND OTHER CHARGES BYLAW No. 228, 2018

A by-law establishing tolls and other charges for the distribution and use of water.

WHEREAS the Gillies Bay Improvement District has authority under the *Local Government Act* to establish tolls and other charges, including charges for capital expenditures payable to the Improvement District and the times of their payment, to establish discounts or percentage additions to encourage the prompt payment of the tolls and other charges, to regulate the distribution and use of water and to establish penalties for failure to comply with the regulations;

NOW THEREFORE the Trustees of the Gillies Bay Improvement District ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Application

1. This Bylaw applies to all Properties, which receive water from the Gillies Bay Improvement District (the "District")

Definition

2. In this Bylaw:
 - a. "**Billing Date**" means the date a bill is prepared by the District, identified as "Date" on the bill provided by the District to a Property owner.
 - b. "**Commercial Property**" means a Property on which an income is derived from the use of the property.
 - c. "**District**" means the Gillies Bay Improvement District.
 - d. "**Property**" includes parcels and lots, and portions thereof where one or more water connection exists, is required or has been requested and provided.

Non-Metered Rates

3. The following **tolls** are hereby fixed and made payable by all owners of Property in the District:

A	For each single family residential Property, either permanent or seasonal, an annual toll of:	\$400.00
B	For additional accommodation on the same piece of Property, utilizing one connection, an annual toll of:	\$400.00
C	For Properties with multiple water connections, for each connection, annual toll of:	\$400.00 per connection
D	For Commercial Properties (including restaurants, Bed and Breakfast, stores, etc.) for each water connection, an annual toll of:	\$400.00 minimum

Metered Rates

4. The following **tolls** are hereby fixed and made payable by all Commercial owners of Property in the District:

A	For Commercial Properties (including restaurants, Bed and Breakfast, stores, etc.) for each metered connection	\$2.00 per m3 of usage beyond the minimum toll
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Time of Payment

5. Tolls become due on **January 1st of each year** for the current calendar year and are payable within 30 days of the invoice date. A discount of **\$20.00** will be allowed on tolls if such tolls are paid within thirty (30) days of the date tolls are payable.

Water Shut Off for Non-Payment

6. The Trustees may, by resolution, order that the water be shut off to any Property where any toll or other charge remains owing 90 days after the Billing Date.
7. Where water has been shut off pursuant to Section 7, an additional charge of **\$60.00** shall apply at the time the water is shut off. A further charge of **\$60.00** shall apply at the time the water is turned back on.

Water Shut Off for Other Reasons

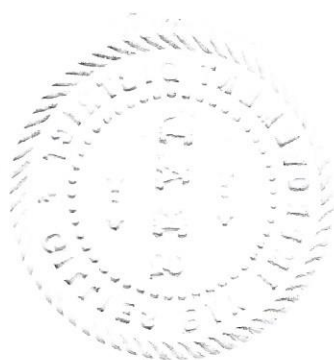
8. Upon application by the owner of the Property, the District may temporarily, for periods not exceeding one (1) month, discontinue the provision of water to a Property upon payment of a **\$30.00** shut off charge.
9. Where water has been shut off pursuant to Section 9, an additional charge of **\$30.00** shall apply at the time the water is turned back on.
10. Additional costs may be applicable where the water operator or contractor(s) must spend time locating and recovering connections which have been made inaccessible by the actions of current or previous parcel owner(s).

Additional Charges

11. If tolls or other charges levied under this bylaw are owing for one year from the due date, the Trustees by resolution, may have the services disconnected from the water works of the Improvement District.
12. A **\$30.00** charge shall apply for each "NSF" cheque.
13. Parcel holders are wholly responsible for damages to water works arising from unauthorized access or tampering. This includes unauthorized turn on or shut off of water valves by persons other than employees or trustees of the District.
14. Where use of water during watering restrictions falls outside of watering regulations, which have been publicly posted or circulated through the local newsletter or Improvement District's website, the District has the right to request compliance with posted water conservation regulation. If parcel holder fails to comply, a meter may be installed at parcel holder's expense and additional fees for water consumption over and above the metered base rate may apply.

Repeal

15. Gilles Bay Improvement District Water Tolls and Other Charges Bylaw 209, 2013 is hereby repealed.


