4) Reports

VFD Report – Rob McWilliam presented his Fire Chief report. Wildfire training was conducted using funds that were received from the CEPF grant. There are now 8 fully licensed First Responders on the department. Open burn ban goes into effect May 15th. Looking at developing an Auxiliary Fire Fighter program with some retired fire fighters.

Motion to support the GBVFD proceeding with developing the Auxiliary Fire Fighter program, moved and seconded by the Board of Trustees

Motion to accept the Fire Chief report moved, and seconded by the Board of Trustees CARRIED

Water Operator – George Kapetanakis presented the Water Operator report. George has been dealing with repairs at the chlorinator and electrical issues. The generator has been serviced and a new electrical panel is to be installed.

New Business

a. Finance Committee Motions

i. GIC Investments

The 90 RBC GIC's matured on April 24th.

Motion The Board authorizes that \$ 40,000 from the Fire Department GIC maturing on April 24th be transferred to the Fire Department operating account, and that the remaining funds be reinvested in RBC GICs maturing in 90 days and paying an interest rate of no less than 4.00% per annum, and that the Board also authorizes that the other GBID GIC's that mature on April 24th be reinvested in RBC GICs for a period of 90 days and paying an interest rate of no less than 4.00% per annum.

The Trustees received copies of the draft 2022 Financials that were provided by DMD. No questions were noted.

c. Statutory Right of Way Update

The offer was completed on April 11th with the assistance of Dean MacDonald (realtor) and presented to Rainer Muenter to present to Selkirk. We have had no response as of today.

d. Water Committee meeting with VCH Officer, Michael Nguyen - discussion

The feedback was that the meeting was positive. The VCH officer had no objection to the proposal to extend the water to Shelter Point Park, as it was an improvement to the system they are currently on. Any improvement is thought to be a step forward.

e. Coastal Water Suppliers Administrative Workshop

Motion to approve sending two Trustees to the CWSA Administrative Workshop on May 2nd, moved and seconded by the Board of Trustees
